The Burnaby parks and recreation commission has approved a special half-price admission to Burnaby Village Museum in support of the Burnaby Christmas Bureau.

The half-price admissions, including unlimited rides on the vintage carousel, will be offered between 4 and 8 p.m. on Dec. 10.

The money will be donated to the Burnaby Christmas Bureau. Toy and coin boxes will also be in place throughout the museum and community recreation centres during the season for any additional gifts to the bureau.

The local Christmas bureau provides seasonal hampers of food and other gifts to needy families over Christmas.
